The 2024–2025 season was an active and successful year for the Marathon Cross Country Ski and Snowshoe Club. Our events brought people together, encouraged outdoor activity, and supported a healthy and connected community.

In December, we partnered with Fresh Air to host a Ski Market and Waxing Clinic at the chalet. This event helped members get ready for the season with new gear, waxing tips, and expert advice.

During the Marathon Winter Festival on Family Day weekend, we offered adult ski lessons, a guided group snowshoe, and free trail access. These activities introduced many new users to the club and our trails. Full Moon Ski and Snowshoe Events in February and March gave participants the chance to enjoy the trails by moonlight and experience a fun, social evening outdoors.

The Marathon Loppet returned on March 8, 2025, with sixteen participants skiing or snowshoeing various distances and celebrating afterward with a pancake lunch. We also hosted group outings for the Marathon Air Cadets and Biigtigong Mno-Zhi-yaaw-gamig, promoting healthy, active living and community connection.

Kids' Ski Lessons returned in February and March, with 14 families taking part. The lessons helped new skiers build confidence and enjoy the sport together. A Used Book Sale held in February raised funds for the club and provided the community with affordable books to enjoy.

The Team Distance Challenge ran all season long with three teams participating. The Daehlie Llamas won the challenge with a total of 277 km skied and snowshoed. Overall, the 2024–2025 season was filled with fun, learning, and community spirit both on and off the trails.
